CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

The third postgraduate workshop organised by the ENECON project focuses on aspects of Integrated Territorial Management and Governance, which have been investigated in several ESPON projects (e.g., TERCO, METROBORDER, LUPA, TOWN, TANGO, etc. see www.espon.eu). Some of the core topics to be dealt with include:

- Governance and territorial cooperation
- Spatial policy in support of specific governance arrangements
- Strategic spatial planning (in relation with infrastructure projects)
- Land-use patterns
- Cities and urban development
- Metropolitan regions (i.e. cross-border polycentric metropolitan region; network of metropolises)
- Territorial impact assessment

TRAVEL LOGISTICS

Getting to Aalborg by plane:

There are over a dozen **direct flights** per day from **Copenhagen to Aalborg** (about 40 minutes) with SAS (<http://www.flysas.com/en>) and Norwegian (www.norwegian.com). Trains from Copenhagen run approximately every hour and take 4.5 hours. Aalborg's airport is located only 5,5 km from the city center.
