

Significant institutional gap in respect of ice

The Ice Circle will be a governmentally mandated collaborative platform, multi-donor trust fund and an international voice encouraging and supporting a multidisciplinary and international response to in the state and impact of changing snow and ice regimes.

It will institutionalize dialogue between snow and ice dependent communities, researchers, policy makers, donors and other actors. This will enable much needed collaboration on research, monitoring, information sharing, generation of adaptive strategies and programmes.


international voice

It will ensure that concerns relating to the state and impact of changing snow and ice regimes are represented in dialogue on water, development, climate change and related agendas. It will serve as an information hub on the relationship between the cryosphere and humans.

fund

The Ice Circle will manage a trust fund that will support programmes around the globe that strengthen research, assess vulnerability and enable the introduction of effective mitigation and adaptation measures.

- Impact social relations




