ESPON 2013 Programme

Mission:

- Support policy development in relation to territorial cohesion and a harmonious territorial development
- Provide comparable information, evidence, analyses and scenarios on territorial structures and dynamics
- Reveal territorial capital and potentials in support of the competitiveness of regions and larger territories

Key principles:

- Policy demand defines applied research themes
- Use of results by stakeholders important •
- Improve the European knowledge base on territorial development and cohesion, including data, indicators, typologies, models and maps
- Support European-wide understanding and involvement by communicating new comparable information for policy development

 Capitalisation, ownership and participation/Capacity building, dialogue and networking

Priority 4 Objective and Actions

Objective:

 Spread of European evidence on territorial trends, perspectives and policy impacts

Main type of actions:

- Capitalisation strategy
- Media and Publications
- European seminars and workshops
- Transnational networking activities (8 projects undertaken by the European Network of ESPON Contact Points: <u>http://www.espon.eu/</u>)

(*The Transnational Networking Activities* provide targeted transnational capitalisation, awareness rising and dissemination of ESPON results with the specific objective of involving policy makers, practitioners, scientists and young academics and promote the European perspective of territorial development, competitiveness and cohesion)

Aim/mission:

- Promote awareness, use and capitalization of ESPON-evidence, a European perspective and transnational cooperation, in territorial development and spatial planning policies and practice
- Facilitate transnational dialogues between policy makers and practitioners, scientists and young academics and students
- Address challenges and opportunities particular to the northern part of Europe, in a wider European context
- Take a macro-regional perspective, focusing the Baltic-Nordic region

ENECON, other outcomes and actions

- Feedback to ESPON on results prepared by project groups, in order to raise awareness about blunders and misinterpretations from a national point of view ("Blunder checks" of DFRs)
- Feedback on relevant national activities undertaken by the ECPs
- Written summary reports from each ENECON event (published at the project website along with presentations and other event-related material)
- Final report (to be submitted by the end of May 2014 and later published)
- On the basis of the three postgraduate workshops, e-learning short courses will be compiled at the open-source PHP Moodle application, including series of web-based lectures (3 x 2 hours), to be offered for academic use in the participating countries





Conference aim and scope:

- Target a selection of ESPON project findings (Priorities 1-3) which are considered particularly relevant in a North European context
- Share and discuss the results and insights achieved in these projects in a Baltic-Nordic macro regional policy and planning context
- The main themes to be addressed are:
 - Territorial scenarios and visions for Europe
 - Economic crisis and resilience of regions
 - Territorial dimension of poverty and social exclusion
 - EU neighboring regions and territorial development
 - Key indicators for territorial cohesion and spatial planning
 - Territorial monitoring system for the Baltic Sea Region
- Learn and assess the relevance of selected ESPON online public tools
 for analytical and practical use of ESPON results
- Learn about other capitalization activities in 2014 and perspectives for ESPON towards 2020 (a third programme phase)
