



THE WOMEN LEAVE BUT THE MEN REMAIN

**- STATISTICS ON THE NORDIC-WELFARE MODEL AND GENDER-
RELATIONS IN TRANSITION -**

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March 2003

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1. Introduction

This document contains statistical data in the Icelandic part of the research project "*Women leave, men remain...Issues of Gender, Welfare and Labour Markets in the Nordic Periphery*". This research project seeks to gather Nordic researchers around a critical perspective on what is happening between women and men on the periphery, seen in relation to the Nordic welfare model and the changing local labour markets.

The purpose of this subproject is to contribute information to a database, which hopefully makes it possible to study statistical changes of the welfare regimes, in a gender perspective, in the specified research area during the last decade. The main research questions in this subproject are:

- A) How has the social structure, in a gender perspective, changed in the study area during the last decade, according to age structure, family structure and the structure of migration?
- B) How has the labour market, in a gender perspective, changed in the study area during the last decade?
- C) How has the political structure, in a gender perspective, changed in the study area during the last decade?

The database is meant to form a basis for studies on local, regional as well as inter-regional levels. A particular purpose will be to support the other subprojects with their need for statistical material so first and foremost the subproject has a descriptive research design. Statistics Iceland has been a main source of information but in other cases information has come from a wide range of other institutions. Frequently the requirements of the project have called for a special analysis of existing data.

The work presented in the following report has been carried out by Hjördís Sigursteinsdóttir B.Sc. at the University of Akureyri Research Institute. Project co-ordinator on behalf of the Institute for Regional Research has been Kjartan Ólafsson, M.A. at the University of Akureyri Research Institute.

2. Data and methods

This research is based on analysis of quantitative data mainly from Statistics Iceland, The Ministry of Health and Social Security, State Social Security Institute, Directorate of Labour and Internal Revenue Directorate. The date is based on whole years during the last decade. The small size of the Icelandic society and its institutes inevitably limits the scope of official statistics in the country. This project reflects this, the chapter of this research vary in scope and detail which is mainly the result of the different status of the statistics in each field.

- *Population size:* Data mainly from Statistics Iceland and presents populations size and population change.
- *Age structure:* Data mainly from Statistics Iceland and presents changes in age structure in study area.
- *Family structure:* Data mainly from Statistics Iceland and presents family status, marital status and nuclear families.
- *Structure of migration:* Data mainly from Statsitics Iceland an presents total migration, migration within municipalities, within region, between regions and external migration.
- *Size and composition of the work force:* Data mainly from Statsitics Iceland and Directorate of Labour and presents unemployment rates, labour market participation, educational level, disabled “workers”, average hours of work and strike and lockouts.
- *Industry structure:* Data mainly from Internal Revenue Directorate and presents employed persons by economic activity.
- *Public services:* Data mainly from The Ministry of Health and Social Security and presents children in pre-primary institutions, beds in retirement home and recipients of social benefits and municipal support.
- *Political structure:* Data mainly from Statsitics Iceland and presents elections to the Icelandic State Parliament and local government elections.

2.1 Study area and definitions

This study is focused on nine communities situated well outside the capital areas. Three of them are traditional fishing communities, three of them service communities and three in agricultural areas. Furthermore information is gathered for the whole country and also divided in capital area against other municipalities.

The communities situated outside the capital areas are from three constituencies, Vesturland, Norðurland vestra and Austurland.

3. The social structure




Figure 1. Total male in study area 1991-2001




Figure 2. Total female in study area 1991-2001




Figure 3. Populations changes by sex 1991-2001




Figure 4. Age structure 1991 and 2001




Figure 5. Children 15 years old and younger living with one adults 1997 and 2001.

3.5. *Regional policy and plan for Iceland 2002-2005*

In its spring session the year 2002, Althing - the Parliament of Iceland, approved a parliamentary resolution on a strategic regional development policy and plan for the period 2002-2005. The parliamentary resolution is based on Article 7 in the Act on the Institute of Regional Development, which states that the Minister of Industry shall submit to the Althing a proposal for a parliamentary resolution regarding a strategic regional development plan for a period of four years. The Institute of Regional Development in Iceland shall supervise and monitor the implementation of the plan, which has the following main objectives:

- To alleviate the differences in living standards and economic opportunities between the inhabitants of different regions in the country and to generate for the people living in the peripheral regions as gainful living conditions as possible.
- To assist communities in the peripheral regions to adjust to rapid socio economic changes by strengthening the local authorities and supporting local economic development initiatives, education, reliable welfare services and the built-up of physical infrastructure.
- To improve living conditions in the peripheral regions by strengthening the largest communities that are most attractive for people to live in and have the greatest opportunities for the development of the local economy, schools, cultural activities and public services.
- To facilitate the development of local cultures, for the advancement of the Icelandic society and to create diverse options for the inhabitants with regard to lifestyle and residence. It entails e.g. to support the preservation of settlements with entrenched history and cultural historic values, as well as to respect the attachment of local residents to their small communities by enabling them to continue to live there.
- To support diversified industrial and economic structure, to alleviate differences in business conditions between regions and assist companies in the peripheral regions to make best use of their

business opportunities with due respect to objectives of sustainable development and responsible environmental policies.

It is proposed that the action taken to achieve the main objectives of the policy and plan will be achieved by pursuing the five following strategic objectives:

1. Growing and diversifying businesses
2. Strengthening communities
3. Enhanced knowledge base
4. Improved transportation
5. Emphasis on sustainable development

It is proposed that the 12 main strategic themes in the regional policy and plan for the period 2002-2005 will be the following:

- Developing new business and employment opportunities
- Competent local development work in all regions
- Well-organized financial support for local development
- Formulation of strategy in sectors where public policies limit production
- Strengthening local government
- Alleviating local and regional disparities in living conditions
- Reducing differences in local and regional business conditions
- Importance of culture
- Developing Akureyri as a growth centre for North and East Iceland
- Transport improvements
- Easy access to telecommunications and information technology
- Increased international co-operation

4. Labour marked

In this chapter we answer the second main research questions: How has the labour market, in a gender perspective, changed in the study area during the last decade. To do that we focus on describing changes in the following variables: size and composition of the work force, industry structure and public services.

The principal source for labor force has for long time been information of working weeks derived from tax returns as well as the official registration of unemployment. These data, however, have many shortcomings, e.g. little possibility of analysis according to various socioeconomic groups, lack of important variables such as working hours and status in employment, and lack of international comparability. Statistics Iceland started its own labour force survey in 1991 based on international recommendations. The first survey was conducted in April 1991 and since then the survey has been conducted twice a year, in April and November.

4.1. Size and composition of the work force

To estimate size and composition of the work force and changes last decade we focus on describing changes in the following variables: unemployment rates, labour market participation, educational level, disabled “workers”, average hours of work per week and strike and lockouts.




Figure 6. Labour market structure 1996.




Figure 7. Labour market structure 1998.




Figure 8. Labour market structure 2002.

4.1.1. Unemployment rates

This chapter presents key facts on unemployment insurance following with tables and figures on unemployment rates, type of employment sought, reasons for leaving last job and length of job search.

Employees and self-employed persons resident in Iceland may be entitled to unemployment benefits when they are unemployed (non EU-citizens must have a permanent work permit). They must be registered at the unemployment office, be actively seeking work and available for the labour market.

Benefits are flat-rate per diem cash benefits. 10 weeks full time work during the last 12 months gives entitlement to minimum benefits and full time

work during the last 12 months gives entitlement to maximum benefits. Part time work reduces the benefits proportionally. In addition self-employed persons must have paid social security contribution during the last 12 months before ceasing employment and becoming unemployed to get full benefits. There is a daily supplement for children. Unemployment benefits shall be paid for every day, except Saturdays and Sundays, during each benefits period. As of January 2003, maximum unemployment benefits shall be ISK 3,574 per day. Minimum benefit shall be 1/4 of the same sum. All unemployed persons receive the same amount of benefits regardless of previous economic situation or former income.

Benefits are paid for a maximum of 5 years. When a person receiving unemployment benefits starts work the benefit period will be prolonged accordingly.

There is no waiting period when the unemployment is not caused by any fault of the employee, but in case of resignation from work or when the employment ceases due to a fault of the employee the waiting period is 40 workingdays for the first time. The benefit period will be reduced accordingly.

An unemployed person who meets the required conditions shall register with one of DL's offices (regional employment exchange offices) or another registration body, which has been approved by the Icelandic Directorate of Labour. Those who have not made an employment search schedule (see further details in a paragraph below) shall be obliged to register each week.

Mandatory employment search schedule: By agreement with each individual person seeking employment, DL's regional employment exchange office shall draw up an employment search schedule within ten weeks of the person's registration. The employment search schedule shall contain the ideas of the person seeking employment and the representatives of the employment exchange office regarding the person's employment potential and what offers and assistance the employment exchange is able to give. After the search schedule has been drawn up the unemployed can in some cases be permitted to register on a two or even four weeks interval (instead of every week).

Special provisions for fish processing employers/workers: The Unemployment Insurance Fund pays the amount of regular unemployment benefits to employers in the fish processing industry to cover basic salaries

of each worker who goes temporarily out of work due to a temporary processing shutdown caused by a lack of raw materials or other related circumstances. The UIF also pays the employer the equivalent of the employer's regular contribution to the workers' pension funds as well as the compulsory insurance levy that is payable to the UIF (mentioned in a previous section). It should be noted that the above is only applicable if the employer in question has a temporary shut-down for more than two days during a calendar year. Each employer can also only receive such payments for maximum 30 consecutive days and for maximum 60 days per calendar year.

Those who do not qualify for unemployment benefits: The following individuals do not qualify for unemployment benefits:

- Those who participate in a strike, or who are affected by a lock-out.
- Those who receive per diem accident or sick-leave payments under the Social Security Act.
- Those who are deprived of their liberty by judgement of a court.
- Those who have resigned their positions without valid reasons or lost jobs for reasons for which they are responsible.
- Those who discontinue their studies before the end of the study term.
- Those who engage in work in their own service which gives them income or the equivalent of income corresponding at least to the maximum amount of unemployment benefit at any given time.
- Those who have attempted to obtain benefit by fraud.

The Unemployment Insurance is financed by a social security contribution imposed on all remuneration paid for dependent personal services and presumptive employment income of the self-employed.




Figure 9. Registered unemployment by sex 1991-2001

4.3.1. Children in pre-primary institutions

This chapter presents tables on children in pre-primary institutions.

Pre-Primary institutions are run by municipalities but there are not pre-primary institutions in every municipalities, mostly the larger one. In many municipalities are daycare in private homes but the Statistics Iceland is not gathering informations about them. Usu

4.3.3. *Maternity/Paternity Leave and Parental Leave*

This chapter presents tables on maternity and paternity leave and parental leave.

Maternity/Paternity Leave is a leave from salaried employment that ensures that parents can spend time with their child in the first months after the

child is born. Salaried employees in the service of others have a right to such a leave as well as self-employed individuals as long as they pay a monthly insurance levy and have been employed on the domestic labour market for six consecutive months prior to the first day of the leave. A parent has the right to a maternity/paternity leave due to a birth, primary adoption or permanent foster care of a child younger than eight years old.

In the year 2000 a new act on maternity/paternity leave was implemented that strengthens the rights of parents. Before that time only mothers had the right to a leave of up to six months. Today mothers have a guaranteed independent right to a leave of up to three months, parents have a joint right to a three months leave that may either be taken entirely by one of the parents or else divided between them, and now fathers also have an independent non-assignable right to a leave of up to three months. The new addition on the rights of fathers was implemented in steps. From January 01, 2002 independent rights of fathers to a paternity leave, due to the birth, adoption or a permanent foster care of a child, was two months, but was increased to three months on January 01 2003. On January 01, 2003 the arrangement of the leave was, furthermore, made more flexible. The right to a maternity/paternity leave lapses when the child reaches the age of 18 months with the exception of when child is adopted or taken into a permanent foster care. A non-custodial parent has the right to a maternity/paternity leave providing that the custodial parent has agreed that the non-custodial parent is to have access to the child during the period of the leave. In special circumstances parents will get different or increased rights to a maternity/paternity leave, or as follows:

- Multiple births: parents will have a joint right to the extension of the leave by three months for each child after the first.
- Stillbirth or a miscarriage: up to three months, a joint right of both parents.

- Illness of the child: up to three months, a joint right of both parents.
- Illness of the mother: Extension of the mother's right, up to two months.

Prior to the year 2001, all mothers received equal payments as a maternity grant. The exception from this rule was the case of governmental employees (both at the State level and the municipal level). These employees received full basic salaries during the leave. Since January 01, 2001 grants are linked to individual income and monthly payments equal 80% of average full salaries of the last 12 months prior to birth, adoption or the start date of a permanent foster care.

A *maternity/paternity grant* is paid to a parent, who is not active in the labour market, who is employed in less than 25% of a full employment position, or who is attending a full-time educational programme, if the parent is permanently domiciled in Iceland and has been domiciled in Iceland for the 12 months preceding the birth, adoption or the start of permanent foster care.

Conditions concerning a permanent domicile are in accordance to the general conditions for domicile presented in the Social Security Act (no. 117/1993).

The amount of maternity/paternity grants is presented in governmental regulation no. 909/2000. The regulation states that parents who are not active on the labour market, or who are employed in less than 25% of a full employment position, shall receive [38,015.- Icelandic kr.] per month. Those who are attending full time educational programmes shall receive [85,798.- Icelandic kr.] per month. Prior to the implementation of the new act in 2001 these groups had no rights to maternity/paternity grants.

Parental leave is a new concept in Iceland that was initiated for the purpose of fulfilling Iceland's commitment to a European Economic Area (EEA) agreement. A parent is entitled to a parental leave of 13 weeks to care for their children. The right to a parental leave will lapse when a child reaches the age of eight years. According to the act parental leave is not accompanied by payment from the Maternity/Paternity Leave Fund.

The total rights of parents (assignable and non-assignable) to a maternity/paternity leave and parental leave is therefore 15 months,

compared to six months in the previous act. However, only during nine of those 15 months the parents are entitled to payments.

4.3.4. Attendance Benefits

This chapter presents tables on attendance benefits.

Those who have custody over a handicapped child, or a child with a long term illness, are entitled to support from The State Social Security Institute (SSI), if a illness, mental handicap, or physical disability causes considerable verifiable costs and/or calls for a special attendance or care. Those who have custody over a child with a serious development disorder or a behavioral problem are also in some instances entitled to support. This support can take two forms:

- a) Certificate used for receiving discounts on medical costs and on the costs of drugs.
- b) Monthly payments to cover special care.

The support is provided for a predetermined time period of up to five years. A decision can be made to provide support for up to two years back in time, if a diagnosis has been completed before the time period in question started and the child's problem has caused considerable costs, and/or called for a special care.

Definitions:

The term *handicapped child* refers to a child, who due to a mental disability (or disturbance), or physical disability, needs a special training, support or care in its childhood life.

A child with a long term illness is a child, who needs a medical treatment in relation to a serious and/or long term illness.

A serious development disorder refers to a state that is the equivalent to a disability.

A behavior problem is a state that is the equivalent to a mental illness.

One of either parents has the right to be absent from work for up to ten working days (80 hours of work for a full time employment) for the purpose of caring for her/his children under the age of 13, given that other caring options are not suitable or available. In such cases an employee is entitled to a full basic salary and a premium and/or bonuses (if applicable) in accordance to general agreements associated with the employment. This right does not influence parents' rights to other regular sick leaves.

4.3.5. Recipients of social security benefits

This chapter presents tables on recipients of social security benefits such as pension insurance. Pension insurance includes old age pension, invalidity pension, pension supplement, pension supplement increase, invalidity allowance, and child pension.

Old age pension: Persons 67 years of age or older who have been resident in Iceland, for at least 3 calendar years between the ages of 16 and 67, are entitled to an old age pension. A full annual old age pension is paid to individuals who have been resident in Iceland for at least 40 calendar years. In cases of shorter periods, the old age pension is paid in proportion to the period of residence. Persons who have worked as seamen for 25 years or longer are entitled to an old age pension from the age of 60.

Invalidity pension: Persons resident in Iceland are entitled to an invalidity pension if they are between the ages of 16 and 67 and:

- (a) have been resident in Iceland for at least the three years immediately prior to application or for six months if their working capacity was unimpaired when they took up residence in Iceland

- (b) have had their permanent invalidity assessed at 75% as a result of a medically recognized disease or disability.

Pension supplement and pension supplement increase: A pension supplement is paid to those who are entitled to an old age pension, an invalidity pension or an occupational injury insurance by the State Social Security Institute (SSI). A pension supplement is also paid to those who are entitled to rehabilitation pension according to the Act on social support (no. 188/1993). If the income of a single person receiving old age pension does not exceed ISK 241,344 per annum he/she shall in addition to his/her pension be paid a pension supplement increase in the amount of ISK 347,244 per annum. If, on the other hand, the pensioner has an income greater than ISK 241,344 per annum the supplement shall be reduced by the equivalent of 45% of the surplus income.

Invalidity allowance: The SSI shall pay an invalidity allowance of ISK 14,992 per month, to persons who have lost at least one half of their working capacity, fulfil the conditions set for residency, and are between the ages of 18 and 62. Those who receive invalidity allowance, and have children under the age of 18 to provide for, shall receive an additional supplement on top of their allowance.

Child Pension: A child pension shall be paid in respect of children under 18 years of age either of whose parents is deceased or is an invalidity pensioner, provided that the child itself or either of its parents has been resident in Iceland for at least three years immediately prior to application. If both parents are deceased or are invalidity pensioners the child pension shall be double.

4.3.6. Recipients of social assistance benefits

This chapter presents tables on recipients of social assistance benefits. Social assistance benefits comprise motherhood and fatherhood allowance, child pension with respect to the education or vocational training of youths aged 18-20, home care benefits, rehabilitation pension, spouse's benefits, widows' and widowers' benefits, household supplement, further household supplement, supplement for the operating costs of an automobile, grants for the purchase of an automobile, and reimbursement for substantial expenses on medical assistance and medicine. Social assistance benefits are only paid to persons permanently domiciled in Iceland.

Motherhood and fatherhood allowance: A motherhood and fatherhood allowance is paid to single parents who provide for at least two children who are less than 18 years of age.

Rehabilitation pension: When the extent of invalidity following sickness or accidents cannot be determined, a rehabilitation pension may be paid for a period up to twelve months after payments of per diem sickness or occupational injury benefits under the Social Security Act have ceased or until the degree of permanent invalidity can be assessed, however, in no case shall the period exceed 18 months.

Household supplements: A single person who receives a full income supplement under the Social Security Act and who runs his/her household alone without the economy of living with others or sharing housing or the cost of board may be granted a household supplement in the amount of ISK 7,711 per month.

Further household supplements: A further supplement may be paid to pensioners if it is clear that the pensioner cannot support himself without it.

Motor Vehicle Costs: An old-age or invalidity pensioner, recipient of an invalidity allowance or home-care payments may be granted a supplement to purchase and to cover operational costs of a motor vehicle which is necessary for the pensioner due to ambulatory incapacity provided the pensioner clearly cannot do without the supplement.

Reimbursement of substantial medical and medicinal costs: If the expenses of an insured person due to medical assistance or medicinal costs are substantial the SSI may reimburse the insured party for the expenses in part or in full subject to income and in accordance with rules issued by the Ministry of Health and Social Security.

Child benefits are assessed and paid on the basis of income and capital as declared for the previous year. Advance payments are made on the 1st of February and the 1st of May each year. The annual amount depends on the age of the children and whether or not the parents are married, cohabiting parents or single. The benefits are reduced according to certain rules when taxable income exceeds a certain limit.

4.3.10. Law of gender quotas

The current legislation on Gender Equality is the Act on Equal Status and Equal Rights of Women an Men no. 96/2000. The aim of this Act is to establish and maintain equal status and equal opportunities for women and men, and thus promote gender equality in all spheres of society.

Government and municipal authorities:

Gender Equality coordinators are appointed in each ministry. Their role shall be to coordinate the gender equality work in every ministry's field, with special emphasis on gender mainstreaming. A close cooperation is between the Centre for Gender Equality and the coordinators. Every four years (after each national) the Minister of Social Affairs shall present to the Parliament a resolution on a four-year program aiming at gender equality. Each ministry proposes and is responsible for implementia detailed plan of action in this regard. The program shall be reviewed every second year.

Municipal authorities shall actively work towards gender equality in the communities as well as in the public administration. They shall appoint Gender Equality committees and set up a gender equality program for each four-year period.

5. Political structure

In this chapter elections to the Icelandic State Parliament as well as municipal elections will be discussed.

5.1. Elections to the Icelandic State Parliament

Elections to Althingi (the Icelandic State Parliament) take place every four years. In the last decade elections were held in the year 1991, 1995, and 1999. Since 1959 the country has been divided into eight constituencies based on an article of the Constitution.

The Parliament consists of 63 Members. The Constitution guarantees each constituency a minimum number of members/seats and a total of 54 seats are allocated in that way. The nine remaining seats are assigned to the constituencies according to the Act on Elections to Althingi (no. 24/2000).

The right to vote in elections to Althingi extends to all Icelandic citizens aged 18 years or over at the time of the election.

Women in Iceland received a partial right to vote in elections to Althingi in 1915, and received full rights in 1920.

At the time of the 1995 election, the official register of voters contained fewer men than women, with a difference of 131. On average each member of the Parliament needed 3,047 votes to ensure a seat, compared to 2,901 in 1991. In 1995 the electorate numbered 167,751 voters. This accounts for 87.4% of the officially registered voters, which is the lowest participation rate since 1946.

5.2. Local government elections

According to the Local Government Elections Act³, municipal councils are elected for a period of four years. The last municipal elections were held in the spring of 2002. The total number of municipal councilors, for each municipality, shall be an uneven number and in accordance with a certain limits that are associated with the population number of the municipality (see Table 138). In spite of these conditions there are no mandatory requirements to decrease or increase the number of municipal councilors until the population number of a municipality has been higher or lower than a given limit in eight consecutive years. The number of municipal councilors shall be officially stated in a resolution made by each municipal council⁴.

Municipal councilors shall be selected through general anonymous elections. The elections can be arranged in either of the two following ways:

- a) *Constrained proportional elections*: Elections that are constrained to predetermined lists of candidates and the proportion of total votes that each list receives will determine how many candidates on each list will obtain a councillorship.
- b) *Non-constrained elections*: Elections where candidates do not have to declare candidacy and all residents of each municipality, who have the right to vote, are considered candidates, unless they are legally exempted or have declared that they do not wish to be seen as candidates prior to the election⁵.

Every Icelandic citizen, who has reached the age of 18 years when an election takes place, and who is legally domiciled in the municipality, is entitled to vote in municipal elections. Furthermore, Danish, Finnish, Norwegian and Swedish citizens, who have been legally domiciled in Iceland for consecutive three years, preceding the electionday, are entitled to vote.

In the last decade municipal elections were held in 1990, 1994 and 1998. The participation rate in municipal election has always been lower than in elections to Althingi, especially where election is arranged through the non-constrained approach.
